Lesson 6 Verb Tenses

3.L.1.e — High

The **tense** of a verb tells when—past, present, or future—an action takes place or a state of being happens. A **present tense** verb describes an action or state of being that is happening right now or happens regularly.

Examples Jeremy walks to the park. (The action is happening now.)

I walk to the store every weekend. (The phrase every weekend indicates that the action happens regularly.)

A past tense verb describes an action or state of being that happened in the past. Regular verbs form the past tense by adding -d or -ed. Irregular verbs form the past tense in other ways.

Example Yesterday, I walked to the store and bought groceries. (The word Yesterday indicates that the actions happened in the past.)

A future tense verb describes an action or state of being that will happen some time in the future. The future is formed by putting the word will in front of the verb.

Example Tomorrow, I will walk to the store. (The word Tomorrow indicates that the action will happen in the future.)

Here are some examples of verb tenses.

Simple Present Tense	Simple Past Tense	Simple Future Tense
am / is / are	was / were	will be
hurry / hurries	hurried	will hurry
carry / carries	carried	will carry
leave / leaves	left	will leave
eat / eats	ate	will eat
put / puts	put	will put
