Lesson 22 Context Clues

2.L.4.a — High

Sometimes the **context**, or surrounding text, helps you figure out the meaning of an unfamiliar word. The other words in a sentence and surrounding sentences become keys to unlocking the meaning of unfamiliar words. Here are a few types of context clues.

Same Meaning Words that have a similar meaning are used in surrounding sentences.

Opposite Meaning Words that have an opposite meaning are used in surrounding sentences.

Definition The word is defined in the sentence or surrounding sentences.

Example Specific examples give clues to the meaning of the word.

Examples

The route we chose was windy and hilly. Along the road, we saw deer and elk.
(The word *road* gives clue about the meaning of the word *route*.)

Partygoers wore a wide range of costumes from fairy princesses to sailor suits to alien monsters.
(Fairy princesses, sailor suits, and alien monsters all are examples of costumes.)

Context clues are especially important when deciding meanings for words that have multiple meanings. The following sentences use the same word: *stamps*. However, the meaning of *stamps* is different. It is only by reading the sentences that you can decide whether the meaning is “stickers used on an envelope to mail it” or “brings one’s feet down heavily on the ground.”

Examples I bought stamps at the post office and mailed my letter.

The toddler stamps his feet during a tantrum because he is angry.
