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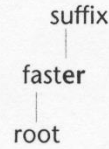
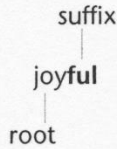

Lesson 24 Roots and Suffixes

2.L.4.c — High

A **root** is the part of a word that creates most of the word's meaning. A **suffix** is a word part that is added to the end of a root.

Examples



Some suffixes are added to words for grammatical reasons. For example, the suffixes *-s* or *-es* form plural nouns, and the suffix *-ed* forms past tense verbs.

Plural nouns: hats, fox**es**

Past tense verbs: jump**ed**, walk**ed**

Other suffixes change the meaning of a root and make a new word. Knowing the meaning of a suffix can give you clues to a word's meaning.

| Suffix | Meaning | Examples |
|----------|------------|--------------------|
| -er, -or | person who | teacher, actor |
| -er | more | faster, slower |
| -est | most | warmest, coldest |
| -ful | full of | joyful, beautiful |
| -less | without | careless, lifeless |

Examples teach + -er teacher ("a person who teaches")
slow + -er slower ("more slow than something else")
cold + -est coldest ("the most cold of all")
beauty + -ful beautiful ("full of beauty")
life + -less lifeless ("without life")

Hint

When suffixes are added to words, the spelling of the word may change. For example, the *y* in *beauty* changes to *i* when the suffix *-ful* is added.

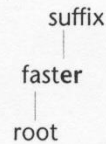
